The canonization of Jeanne Jugan has sparked great excitement among the employees," explains Bing Varias, Activities Director. Canonization Date Set for October 11, 2009

Pilgrims to Rome

A delegation from San Pedro is looking forward to joining many pilgrims from around the world in Rome for the canonization of Blessed Jeanne Jugan. Mother Marguerite, two Residents, seven Association Jeanne Jugan (AJJ) members and two others make up the official group. More are traveling independently and will connect with the delegation for the ceremony.

Expressing the sentiment of many in the delegation, Barbara West states, "It will be an incredible experience to witness Little Sisters and their Residents and supporters from all over the world joining together as one big family for the celebration."

The San Pedro delegation will depart Tuesday, October 6th, and will join pilgrims from San Francisco, Denver, Gallup and Kansas City in New York. After an overnight, the combined group will fly to Rome. A total of one hundred twenty persons will represent the eleven Homes of the Chicago Province.

The group will arrive in Rome on the morning of Thursday, October 8th. In the days preceding and following the canonization, they will tour St. Peter's Basilica, Medieval Rome, the Coliseum, the Roman Forum, the Home of the Little Sisters of the Poor and many more important sites.

"It's a busy schedule," observes Resident Jean Pytel. "I've never been to Rome and look forward to all the rich history."

The Canonization will take place in St. Peter's Square in front of St. Peter's Basilica on the morning of Sunday, October 11th. Pope Benedict XVI will preside. A very large tapestry of Jeanne Jugan will hang in the square and big screen TVs will be provided so that no one misses any aspect of the ceremony.

"I can envision Jeanne Jugan smiling as she looks down on all the happy faces in St. Peter's Square," says Mother Marguerite. "She will be repeating one of her favorite sayings, 'Blessed be God. Thank you, my God. Glory be to God."

Back home in San Pedro, everyone plans to watch the canonization on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN) in simulcast or on one of the repeat broadcasts.

He has served as an associate pastor, a hospital chaplain, the director of the Family Life Services of the Archdiocese, and pastor in three different parishes.

Roadway Upgrades



Major improvements are in process to the roadways around our Home to insure safety, usability, and durability for the long-term.

The traffic on Western Ave. has increased substantially over the years making it important to improve safety at our entrance. The new wider driveway now allows for both incoming and exiting cars. (photo 1) Plus, the security gate has been relocated to allow for a queuing lane for incoming automobiles. (photo 2)

To save on the wear and tear to the roadways, trash pickup has been consolidated to limit truck usage of the roads. The drainage system has been expanded to keep the water from pooling on the asphalt and from draining into the buildings.

Much needed parking has been added in an unused corner of the sideyard. (photo 3) New walkways provide pedestrian safety to and from the





building and better handicap access for our Residents.
