

Residence received the Quality
Award Certificate for outstanding and
exemplary care. The award was given by
the State of California, Department of
Health Services Licensing and
Certification Program. Less than 1% of
all California licensed facilities were
recognized for this Quality Award. Only
106 awards were given to the over 1,400
facilities considered, according to Greg
Roth of the Department of Health
Services

"The entire staff can take great pride in this award," said Sr. Sharon, Director of Nursing. 



The General Chapter Meeting in France

ur General Chapter was held from September 6 through October 6, 2002, at our Motherhouse, La Tour Saint Joseph in Brittany, France. Seventy-one Little Sisters, representing the entire Congregation, gathered for this important moment in the life of our religious family.

Every six years, representatives of the Little Sisters from every continent gather at the Motherhouse to elect a Superior General and six Assistant Generals. Mother Celine de la Visitation was re-elected as Superior General. Mother Celine is from the United States and the first in her position who is not a native of France.

"The Little Sister capitulars spoke in French, Spanish or English during the General Assemblies. As they met together to work on various aspects of our consecrated life and our mission, it was very impressive to see how, despite the different cultures and mentalities, they were profoundly united in the charism of humble service to the elderly; a precious inheritance from our mother, Jeanne Jugan," said Sister Maria, a Little Sister from San Pedro who served at the Chapter as a translator.

The closing of the General Chapter was an invitation to a new beginning for the Congregation, one to be lived in humble confidence as we "put out into the deep." Echoing our Holy Father, Mother General encouraged the Little Sisters to, "remember the past with gratitude, live the present with enthusiasm, and look forward to the future with confidence: 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever' (Heb 13:8)."
